Explanations of the exams and assessment below...

Kindergarten Early Assessment, also known as a kindergarten readiness assessment (KRA), is a test that evaluates a child's readiness for kindergarten.

WIDA Screener is an assessment used to identify students who are English Language Learners (ELLs) by measuring their English language proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, helping educators determine if a student needs additional English language support services.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) Baseline Test is a standardized assessment used to establish a student's initial academic performance level at the beginning of a school year, providing teachers with a starting point to track their progress and tailor instruction throughout the year based on individual strengths and weaknesses.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) Mid-Cycle Progress refers to a mid-year assessment that measures a student's academic growth in reading and math compared to their baseline performance at the beginning of the school year, allowing teachers to monitor progress and adjust instruction accordingly.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) End of Cycle refers to the final administration of the MAP assessment given to students at the end of a school year, which measures their overall academic growth throughout the year compared to their baseline performance at the beginning of the year.

WIDA Access is a standardized assessment used to measure the English language proficiency of students identified as English Language Learners (ELLs) from grades K-12.

NAA is a state-administered test designed for students with significant cognitive disabilities who cannot participate in the standard standardized tests based on their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

SBAC is a standardized test that measures a student's progress in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics, assessing their understanding of key concepts aligned with Common Core State Standards at their grade level.
